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1. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

1.1 INTRODUCTION

In this pursuit, the college continues to guide the vision and mission of the college in the 21st century. Following a community approach, the college's locus and focus is to look after the welfare of all its stakeholders, namely, students, faculty, staff and alumni. Our institute acknowledges the significance and importance of the fast changing environment and the need to keep abreast with the growing and changing demands of the new world. Our endeavor is to provide a platform for the young minds to hone their skills in academia, co-curricular and extracurricular activities, along with personal discovery and growth. 1.2 Strength, Weakness, Opportunity and Challenges(SWOC)

Institutional Strength

It has well qualified faculty who work sincerely and efficiently.

The non teaching staff is hardworking and cooperative.

Since the inception of the college, not a single case of sexual abuse, ragging, discrimination on the basis of caste, class, creed, gender and religion has been reported,

The administration is cooperative with the staff members and students.

The student's performance is generally good. The first division rate falls between 60-100%. There are very few failures and drop outs.

The college library houses a collection of approx. 35000 books, journals and magazines.

The students do not smoke or show any rowdy tendencies.

There are several research scholars pursuing Ph.D.

The clubs, societies and associations remain active and functional throughout the year.

The co-curricular and sports activities are represented at International and National Level like in sports Asian Games, Commonwealth Games, World University Sports Competition, AIU organized All India Interuniversity sports meet, National Level sports competitions organized by various Federation and Associations. In Cultural activities our college has participated in AIU organized SAUFEST (South Asian University Festival) and All India Interuniversity Youth Festivals and North Zone Inter University Youth Festivals several times.

NSS is functional right from grassroots to the upshoots. NSS volunteers as well as the PO's have recognition at National level.

The college has improved its e-resources.

College has successfully compiled and uploaded the data on all India Survey of Higher Education (AISHE) for the last four years under the MHROD.

Chhotu Ram Arya College is the only co-educational college for offering Science, Commerce and Humanities both at UG as well PG level.

The institute is well known for its community service.

No serious grievances or strike by students and staff have been reported in the institute for the last 20 years.

“Equality” is the motto of the college.

Regarding the discrimination or indiscipline, different policies and cells have been constituted.

The institute’s administration and teaching and non-teaching staff members work together with a feeling of unity and belongingness.

The institute provides various short-term certificate courses for students and staff members.

We organize faculty development and student development programs.

Institutional Weakness

67% of our faculty is ADHOC.

There is no Vice Principal to support the administration.

Many of our non-teaching staff is on ADHOC basis.

The administrative and accounts heads e.g. A.O. (accounts), Librarian have retired and new appointments are not permitted by Director General, Higher Education, Haryana for reason unknown.

Our Infrastructure needs renovation and expansion.

There is water logging problem in the surrounding colonies and severely affects the approach to the college.

There is no hostel facility in the college.

Institutional Opportunity

There are several research scholars who are pursuing Research work which is giving motivation to the students to carry out research at post-graduate level.

There are several MoUs signed with the outside institution which is bringing in improvement in facilities,

enrichment and internship programmes of the college.

The college has agreed to use its rooftop for energy generation through solar panels.

The college publishes its magazine wherein students can write and publish their articles.

The college plans to open entrepreneurship cell within its premises.

The work at NSS cell helps in community outreach program,

The college has started the renovation and expansion work for which enough funds are available

We wish to establish college as Zero Waste Discharge Unit.

The college has been running the evaluation centre of under-graduate as well as post-graduate programmes for the last Fifteen years and helping in timely declaration of University results.

The college has been the examination centre for State Level and National Level Competitive and Eligibility test Examinations.

The college run short term certificate courses for students to make them both employable and self-employable.

Our college provides opportunity to serve community.

Our college has provision to provide special facilities to sports person and participants of cultural activities.

College has very good infrastructure for sports and cultural activities.

Our college has strong alumni network helping in job placement assistance and guidance.

Institutional Challenge

College has to bear the construction work going on in the campus.

The distribution of students in the credit based system disturbs the workload of the departments.

The college has to make permanent appointments of teaching and Non teaching Grant-in-aid posts after approval from the O/o Director General, Higher Education, Haryana, which are not given to us for the last 10 years, so college have to appoint the deficit staff on SFS basis and have to bear more than Rs1.25 crore on the college exchequer.

The college has been the Evaluation centre for evaluation of UG as well as PG Exams. This is one of the biggest sections of evaluation centre which has to be managed by faculty and nonteaching staff with limited resources.

To strengthen alumni base and track student progression.

To provide as much choice as possible under CBCS given infrastructure and staff constraints.

Most of the students hail from rural background and the public transportation is not punctual so they have to remain dependent on the mercy of Public transportation and college has to prepare the time-table keeping this factor in mind.

Most of the students are from economically weaker section, so they are unable to pay fees in one installment. So college has to give some relaxation in the payment of Fees which very severely tell upon the financial health of the institution.

Students who are placed in any organization do not want to share the selection letter because its probable misuse by any person. So it becomes very difficult of the college to provide document to prove our claim.

1.3 CRITERIA WISE SUMMARY

Curricular Aspects

The vision and mission of Chhotu Ram Arya College targets to make students empowered and enriched persons capable of bringing social change.

The college publishes its detailed Handbook of Information (HBOI) every year. The IQAC monitors its implementation from time to time.

College has three faculties, Arts, Commerce, Science. The college teachers actively participate in curriculum design at university level, and are part of Executive Council of the University, Post-graduate Board of Studies, BOS, Academic Council, and University Court. College is signatory to several MoUs with university, other HEI's and small scale industries. NEP implementation will not be a big problem because of these faculties.

The co-curricular activities such as group discussions, workshops, seminars, lectures, competitions and festivals have been organized in college. Various activities are organized by Women Cell, Eco club, NSS, Literary Cell integrate cross cutting issues such as Gender issues, Climate change, and Human Rights issues. The Sustainable Health Program, initiatives of NSS, YRC, RRC, and NCC all ensure holistic development.

In Sports and Cultural activities, students have participated up to AIU recognized international level.

The Certificate Course in Soft Skill and Skill Development courses are designed to give additional dimensions to student's education and employability. Skill based programs are organized without any fee during the vacations and mid semester breaks.

The college is also one of the Examination center of University's Directorate of Distance Education and holding examinations of the students of distance mode of education on our campus for more than 35 years where nearly 1000 students take examination both written and practical.

The CBCS in PG classes which is introduced by the university in 2016, which is providing greater flexibility in education.

College has a fully automated library and an active placement and an entrepreneur development cell.

Our college is center of 'On the Spot Evaluation Centre' of UG and PG classes established by Examination Cell of Maharshi Dayanand Uuniversity Rohtak.

We have fully developed labs like Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physical Education, Geography, Computer Science, Language Lab.

We have centrally air-conditioned Auditorium with a seating capacity of 200 persons.

Teaching-learning and Evaluation

The teaching-learning and evaluation schedule are organized as per the university academic calendar. The college follows admission guidelines given by Director General, Higher Education, Haryana (DGHE) and the affiliating University.

For the convenience of the students a helpdesk is created in the college. The reservation policy of Government of India is followed for admission to fill SC, ST, OBC, PwD, ESM, EWS and ward quota for armed forces.

College is sensitive to the needs of Differently Abled students and necessary steps are taken to impart holistic education to them.

College has prepared criteria of Fee Concession under four broad categories viz. Academics, Sports, Cultural activities and other Categories. Under other categories Parentless Child, Fatherless Child, Ward of Class III and IV college employees are included for fee concession.

The tutorials, assignments, certificate courses help to bridge the knowledge gap of students. The courses are usually finished in time. The result analysis of weak students is used to ascertain the risk of dropout amongst students, and they are advised to change the subjects if required or take extra classes.

The institution nurtures critical thinking through GD debates at inter/intra college levels. College also promotes innovation projects in science exhibition conducted by state govt. and creative writing in magazines.

College sensitizes its students towards society and environment through its various clubs and societies by organizing rally, *nukkad natak*, discussion sessions.

By using ICT, projector, innovative techniques like Model Making, Power Point Presentations. Assignments, Seminar, Workshops, Training Program, Educational Trips, the teachers enhance learning process.

The students are regularly counseled for career, placement, psychological and health issues.

The teachers are recruited on the basis of rigorous selection criteria prepared by Director General Higher Education, Haryana.

The institution promotes research and innovation, and to undertake the Doctoral research activities. The college

also grants leave for such activities.

The college has the feedback system to evaluate the performance of teacher in teaching learning process. The college has e-resources that help the students for examination. The teachers have also introduced MCQ for some papers and topic in the e-resources.

Research, Innovations and Extension

Besides being an academic institution focusing on quality education, Chhotu Ram Arya College is actively involved in encouraging research. The goals and objectives for research promotion have been defined and a strategic plan has been prepared for promoting and strengthening research.

The college is committed to promote an environment which is conducive for undertaking research;

ü To promote research in academics, the institution motivates its teacher to start research to obtain the degree of M. Phil or Ph. D. The teachers are encouraged to do active research and apply for Patents.

ü They are also motivated to get their research work published in the national and international journals. Special lecture series are arranged to give them training for writing papers for publication.

ü The College allows duty/Academic leave for attending seminars & conferences for which delegate fee is also reimbursed.

ü The College provides the needed educational journals, books, encyclopaedia, stationery and secretarial assistance etc.

ü It provides the information to all the staff members regarding the research seminars being held at different places.

ü Research scholars from outside and within the college are invited to share their research findings and reports with the faculty and PG students which creates a culture of research among them.

ü Ever since the start of the college it has shown its interest in improvement of theory and practice of teacher education by emphasizing experimentation and innovation following a research based approach.

ü Research facilities have been augmented

1. Our faculty members are also empanelled as Research Supervisors with the affiliating University and other universities.
2. by providing leased line internet facility
3. by providing more computers
4. by supervising outside research scholars. A few of these scholars have submitted their thesis successfully.

In PG courses, term papers have been introduced to lay the foundation for future research work. Different

departments organize lectures and workshops on Research Methodology. Our faculty visits various institutions and organizations as resource persons. Faculties are also involved in writing books, contributing chapters in books and editing books. One of our faculties is recipient of prestigious state Sponsored Haryana Sahitya Academy award.

Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The up-gradation of facilities and resources is an ongoing process to facilitate teaching and learning process:

- We have fully developed and updated labs of Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physical Education, Geography, Computer Science and Language Lab. The college encourages use of digital presentation of college programs.
- The college has well equipped and automated library which has been renovated to provide maximum seating capacity. The library has latest and old books, journals and e-resources. It also gives access to Inflightnet, *Shodh Ganga*, and *Shodh Sindhu*.
- The National Service Scheme unit of college takes care of the needs of differently abled students. Ramps are provided and hindrance free passages facilitate their safe movement. A toilet specifically designed for their convenience is functional in college.
- The college provides health care in terms of awareness programs, counseling centers and a medical room with YRC teacher as its in charge.
- The college has a girls common room.
- The computers have become integral part of education. They are available in office, administration, computer labs, science labs, language lab and NSS room. The college has signed annual maintenance contract for their upkeep.
- All the departments have their own separate rooms.
- The LCD projectors are installed to maximum extent to facilitate ICT enabled teaching-learning process.
- The college maintenance funds are regularly utilized to renovate and maintain the college, to buy furniture, computers, books and equipment.
- The technically qualified laboratory staffs keep science labs in working condition. The stock verification is undertaken annually.
- Estate Officer of the college helps in the upkeep and maintenance of the building.
- For the participants of cultural activities, a separate hall and funds have been provided.
- For the sports aspirants institute provides 400 meter track, and nursery for different games being run jointly by government of Haryana and India.
- We also have centrally air-conditioned Auditorium with a seating capacity of 200 persons.
- The college canteen is furnished periodically by discarding old and worn-out furniture and replacing it with new one.

Student Support and Progression

For the students support and progression, the college prints its Hand Book of Information every year at the time of admission containing details of fees, courses and curriculum, departments, facilities available, activities of various college societies, clubs and associations, Scholarships offered by the college and rules related to college

discipline and examinations.

The college offers scholarships to meritorious students, and fee concessions to the needy students, parentless child, position holders in sports and cultural activities. The concessions for reserved categories and PwD students are given by Government. Approximately 13 lakhs has been disbursed to the needy students in past four years.

Barrier free and toilet to facilitate PwD students are in college.

The skill based courses are organized for interested students.

The slow learners are given special attention in the college during tutorials.

The students have opportunity of publishing articles, stories, poems and artwork in various magazine published by college and showcase them in departmental activities.

The college has four co-curricular, twelve clubs and 13 departmental activities run by students and mentored by teachers for the welfare of the students.

Counseling for academic, psychological, health and career issues is provided within the college. The Placement Cell has helped in placement of around 300 students in last 4 years.

There is Grievance Redressed Cell to lodge their complaints.

The Internal Complaint Committee comprising Anti-sexual harassment and Gender Sensitization Committee is well constituted and fully functional.

The anti-ragging cell in college is alert to avert any ragging incidences in the premises.

The college has its Alumni Association registered which meets every year. One alumnus is called as guest of honor on the annual day.

The college has high pass percentage which ranges from 69-100% and dropout rate is low.

College takes feedback from students on academic, co-curricular and extracurricular activities. The feedback is analyzed by IQAC.

College has cultural and sports committees, around 25 varieties of games and 36 of cultural activities are available. Students have participated up to AIU recognized international levels.

All the facilities have been provided without any discrimination on the basis of caste, class and gender.

Governance, Leadership and Management

Chhotu Ram Arya College has a legacy of academic and professional excellence and has been a pioneer in

curricular and co-curricular activities since its inception in 1951. The mission of college is to develop human intellect, personality, interpersonal skills while instilling in them the right value system.

During Orientation Days and college Annual Day the vision, mission and objectives of the college are being conveyed.

The program curriculum is enriched by numerous activities designed by our faculty which lays the foundation for conceptual understanding.

The college has signed MoU with external institutions and agencies.

The college is stepping towards community outreach programmes.

College encourages faculty to organize and attend national and international conferences and workshops. The non-teaching staff is also encouraged to participate in various workshops like ICT training and health & Hygiene etc.

The constant up-gradation of faculty resume is collected annually. The performance appraisal is done at the time of promotion.

The welfare schemes of the staff enable them to avail gratuity, CPF, NPS, Pension, leave encashment and fee concession to the wards of 4th class employees.

The college funds come from Grant-in-aid from Govt. of Haryana, UGC, college trust, and student fees and other funds. The internal and external audit is done every year and keeps a check and suggests optimal usage of finances.

The college promotes participative management as the Governing Body includes Principal, two teaching and one non-teaching staff representatives who participate in all policy decisions.

The institution has IQAC that monitors the academic, co-curricular, extracurricular, infrastructural needs, improvements strategies, feedback and best practices of the college. The IQAC consists of Principal, coordinator, six senior faculty members of college, one representative of Governing body, alumnus, student, parent of a student, industrialist and administrative officer of the college.

Based on the comparative analysis of academic results by the IQAC the authorities formulate policies to deal with weak sectors and suggest improvement measures.

College also gets AAA, Gender, Environment, Green and Energy Audits done to maintain quality assurance in these areas.

The college provides all the facilities for sports and cultural activities.

The female staff and students have full participation in institute.

Institutional Values and Best Practices

Chhotu Ram Arya College has a long history of imparting quality education to all sections including the underprivileged and marginalized sections of society. The institute is known for its quality education provided through innovations in curriculum, co-curriculum and extra curriculum activities.

- Apart from formal education the college has been continuing its long-running practice to serve rural community, this practice has been institutionalized as **“Adopt a Village” in 2020-2021.**
- College is well known for its co-curricular activities i.e. sports and cultural activities. These activities have opened new avenues for participants, as Haryana Govt. has launched various schemes for outstanding sports persons and cultural activities participants in the shape of weightage of marks and reservation of seats in Class-I, Class-II, Class-III and Class-IV cadre.
- The institute conducts various audits like AAA, Environment audit, Green audit and Energy audit. After the comprehensive study of audits various reformative steps have been taken.
- Fluorescent bulbs have been replaced with LED bulbs. It is planned to set up solar panels to generate electricity.
- The waste paper is sent for recycling.
- Provisions are being made for water harvesting.
- The plantation drive and cleanliness drive take place from time to time.
- The laboratory staff is trained to dispose of hazardous waste properly.
- The e-waste is being collected and sent to recycling units.
- Computerization and installing of latest computer software in accounts and administrative sections have made the functioning of these sections more efficient.
- The institute has been working hard to maintain and sustain a lush green campus.
- Gender audit was conducted recently in 2022-2023. This audit proved significant for creation of gender sensitization and gender equality. These audits proved helpful to produce all round development of institute, staff members and students as well.
- The institute creates informal platforms to spread awareness in and outside campus. Under this program staff members used to go to different villages and with the prior permission of *sarpanch* (Village head) they establish healthy interaction sessions with villagers and inform them about govt. policies.

Institutional preparedness for NEP

<p>1. Multidisciplinary/interdisciplinary:</p>	<p>Chhotu Ram Arya College is a multidisciplinary institute having all three faculties i.e. Arts (humanities), Science, Commerce. So at the institute level, there is no problem whether Instructional or infrastructural in the implementation of a multidisciplinary/ interdisciplinary curriculum. As soon as the university implements the NEP, the college will implement it at the same moment. Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak is the affiliating university of our college. University discussed the implementation of NEP in several rounds of its meeting and planned to introduce 4-year Multidisciplinary Undergraduate programs with multiple entry and multiple exit provisions. In this</p>
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regard, various committees department-wise are constituted to examine and design the course curriculum of various integrated programs with lateral entry and lateral exit provisions as envisaged in the NEP 2020. The University will follow UGC guidelines in letter and spirit on multiple entry and exit provisions in the 4-year UG program and later the PG programme as well. In the UG program, a certificate, diploma, or degree will be awarded according to the credits prescribed in the guidelines after the successful completion of 1 year and 2 years respectively. Bachelor's honors degree will be awarded after successful completion of 4 years either through research/or course work. There will be more focus on the Skill component and suggestions from various stakeholders are invited to incorporate it with the general education. The final decision rests with the duly constituted committee for each of the UG programmes followed by approval from the academic council. All PG courses run by our college have a CBCS syllabus in which students of all PG programs are required to study one foundation elective course in 2nd semester. They may choose any one of the courses prescribed in the syllabus excluding the courses offered by the departments of their subjects. These offered courses are multidisciplinary in nature Basics of Accounting, Basics of E-Commerce, Computer Fundamentals, Appreciation of Poetry, Appreciation of Drama, Moral Education, etc. Many other programs have outreach and extension activities that facilitate community engagement, environmental awareness, human values, etc. To catalyze multidisciplinary exposure, the college has established a platform to address societal problems relevant to the 21st century (viz. Green Chemistry, disease biology and human health, food processing, nutrition, clean energy, and climate change, etc). There are about 74 faculty members with diverse disciplinary backgrounds belonging to different Schools of Science and Technology, Commerce, Management Sciences, and Humanities. Faculty members from Science & Technology know all the stakeholders about machine learning, and human health with emphasis on Cancer, Drug abuse etc. Faculty members from Humanities and Commerce are focusing on addressing socio-cultural problems. Since 1951, every year 100 NSS volunteers with diverse academic backgrounds and exposure join

	<p>NSS and take part actively in spreading awareness among the various stakeholders. Sports Dept. in collaboration with various college committees teaches the value of Yoga and its relation with regard to vata, pitta, and kapha.</p>
<p>2. Academic bank of credits (ABC):</p>	<p>a. Our college is affiliated constituent college and Academic Bank of Credit is the sole responsibility of the affiliating university. As ABC is one of the important components of the NEP-2020 to be implemented by the Academic Institutions. University is deliberating to start 4 years UG programme with multiple entry provisions from Academic Year 2023-24. For its effective implementation, the University decided to register for the Academic Bank of Credit. b. The University has registered for the ABC through the Digilocker and NAD portal. This facility is vital in view of University's Plan to start 4 year UG programme with multiple entry-exit options. c. The University has been making every effort for the internationalization of education and credit transfer after the notification of NEP 2020. d. Our Departmental Advisory Committees of the concerned Departments discuss the revision or development of a new curriculum, and the committee assigns selected faculty members to study the entire syllabus very minutely and orient other staff members regarding new syllabus and study material thereof. The concerned faculty members design the study material and make it available to all the students both physically and digitally. The concerned faculty members integrate the essential corrections/alterations as they deem fit and give them the final shape for distribution among the students. e. We will very soon start an orientation programme on ABC both for the students as well as the faculty members and will make them aware of all the existing provisions, that may be considered good practices pertaining to the Implementation of ABC.</p>
<p>3. Skill development:</p>	<p>a. College has a vision to make the students self-employable and self-sustainable and to achieve this mission college has created CENTRE FOR SKILL DEVELOPMENT. b. The college has offered vocational and skill-based programmes under value-added courses like certificate/Diploma courses. c. A department of Vocational Studies and Skill Development is established under the aegis of the Career and Counseling Cell which is entrusted with</p>

the task to take necessary actions to formulate the framework for integrating vocational education with formal education as per the mandates of NEP2020. d. This cell will also offer crash courses on soft skills for students as suggested by National Skills Qualifications Framework (NSQF). e. Vocational courses offered in College: 1. The college is offering a few mandatory credit courses that help to create awareness among students about the Indian constitution, social responsibilities, banking & investment, business & accounting, Computing, and critical analysis of different genres. 2. The College has provided a platform for the research aspiring students to undertake Multi-Disciplinary Research in areas involving the integration of value components to research in various disciplines. 3. The college is running various Sports nurseries like Basketball, Hockey, and Athletics on the college campus in association with Haryana Govt. These nurseries offer both infrastructural as well as instructional facilities to budding sportspersons without any financial burden on them. Another landmark is the Yoga Centre at the campus offers the facility to various stakeholders aware of the outcome of “Yoga for Positive Health”. 2. The affiliating University has engaged services of industry persons to provide skill training in vocations like Tech Mahindra which is also available to the affiliating colleges. Besides this, our college has also independently linked with various industries of the area for skill training like Assembly and repair of R.O. Water plants of capacity above 500 ltr./hr with Aquatak Pure Water Solutions Pvt. Ltd., Hans Films, Parashar Dairy Farm, Malik Mushroom Farming, Saroha Organic Farm, Gahlawat Poultry, Pradeep Refrigeration, DT Pearl Farming, Maoj Woodworks, Batra Electricals, etc. 3. The university’s Ordinance and scheme of examination of different courses allows admission to Graduate in various formal streams of education. Based on performance at qualifying exams, B. Voc graduates are admitted to programs like MBA, M.A., M.Sc., etc., and Diploma holders in B.Tech. Lateral Scheme, B.Sc., B.A. etc.

4. Appropriate integration of Indian Knowledge system (teaching in Indian Language, culture, using online course):

The College has a Department of Cultural Activities which works with the stated objective of giving training to students to integrate and apply the knowledge of traditional knowledge of folk culture to

real-life situations. Further, the Department organizes workshops to train students and document the live processes of the making of traditional crafts. In addition, the Department has worked towards the revitalization of cultural resources such as folk songs and folk dance for communicating positive messages in society. Besides this, the college also participates actively in the folk festival “Falgun Mela” (?????) organized by the Directorate of Youth Welfare, Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak. In this mega event, competitions on Folk Food, Folk Art, Folk Games, Folk Music, Folk Dance, Folk Literature, etc. are organized at the state level. The videos of folk dance are uploaded on “YouTube”, “And Facebook” so that viewers who are from far-fetched places may be benefited from this online social platform. The mode of instruction and teaching is in Hindi and to make it more comprehensible, local dialect is used by the teachers. The faculties and staff of the college are trained from time to time in Hindi and English. In addition, many of the faculties are well-versed in the local dialect and are confident about being able to teach bilingually. Our college has a Dept. of Sanskrit which teaches Sanskrit as a Compulsory as well as optional subject at the undergraduate level. The Hawan Ceremony is a biannual feature of the college which is observed in Sanskrit. Besides this, our college encourages the students to participate in competitions like One Act Play (Sanskrit), Sanskrit Declamation Contest, and Sanskrit Saloka Uchcharan Contest in Youth Festival organized by Youth Welfare Dept. Maharshi Dayanand University, Rohtak. To enrich our ancient Traditional Knowledge, the college organizes guest lectures by eminent scholars on Ancient Indian Traditions from time to time. Our College also organizes educational tours to Archeological sites like Mithathal (Bhiwani), Bamla (Bhiwani), Makbra of Sheikh Chili (Sonipat), Bnawali (Fatehabad), Rakhi Garhi (Hisar) to familiarize the students with Ancient civilization. Our college has a Herbal Garden which has more than 200 hundred types of Herbal plants with placards showing the medicinal importance in terms of Ayurveda and the Unani system of medicine. Our college students actively participate in Indian Art like Indian Classical Music Vocal, Indian Classical Music Percussion, Indian Classic Music Non-percussion, and Classical Dance and secure top position at State

	<p>Level and National Level. Every year the students participate in cultural activities that enhance their knowledge about Indian culture. Special sessions on yoga and meditation imbibe Indian Values in the students. The curriculum of some subjects like Hindi, English, History, and Sanskrit are designed to inculcate and promote Indian Culture and the Indian knowledge system. Raising awareness about the possibility of integrating traditional Indian knowledge systems like Bijana making, Pidha weaving, Phooljhari making, Indhi making, Sanjhi Making, Doll Making, Mehandi etc. as a part of Folk and Cultural Studies programme.</p>
<p>5. Focus on Outcome based education (OBE):</p>	<p>The institution is proactive in the implementation of OBE. As the curriculum was revised in 2016 to CBCS pattern by the affiliating University with a vision to look through a futuristic perspective of integrating OBE. Evaluation of OBE is carried out by our expert faculty members and formulated a framework. The Learning OBE Framework (LOCF) was considered to formulate PLOs that were in alignment with the vision and mission of the college. After a series of deliberations, a workshop was organised to internalise the PLOs. The programme learning outcome and programme specific outcome were formulated in alignment with the PEO. The faculty formulated course outcomes for their respective courses and mapped with programme outcome or programme specific outcome. The evaluation team then analysed the PO/PSO/CO on the basis of data collected through Direct and Indirect Tools. The Parameters set by our intitute for Direct Tools are Internal and External Theory Assessment. In Indirect Tools the parameters are Exit Survey/Curriculum Feedback and Parents Feedback. The total weightage is divided into 80:20 between Direct and Indirect Tools. On the basis of the result of PO/PSO/CO, faculty evaluation is carried out and the faculty members are guided and instructed accordingly.</p>
<p>6. Distance education/online education:</p>	<p>The pandemic has forced institutions to have a definitive program for online education. Our institution has used the opportunity and potential of our faculty and infrastructure in offering the courses through online platforms. For this purpose, workshop and training programs on Online classes, Online Examination and Online Evaluation for the faculty</p>

members are conducted by our college. Students were offered the regular Undergraduate and Post-graduate curriculum through online mode for all the semesters. Students were encouraged to take up courses for their upskilling. As MOOCs have emerged as a platform of open and distance learning and SWAYAM platform is offering MOOCs, our institution has pitched on online courses through SWAYAM for Under-graduate and Post-graduate students. The institution has earmarked six hours per week for students to take up online courses and College has created its own e-content in PDF/Audio-Video/YouTube format on our college website.

The Institution ensures effective curriculum planning and delivery through a well-planned and documented process including Academic calendar and conduct of continuous internal Assessment

Response:

Institution runs various UG and PG courses designed by Maharshi Dayanand University and plans the academic calendar which includes Curricular and co-curricular activities. The time-table committee prepares the schedule as per university norms. Institution also runs Certificates, Value-added programs, designed by our own faculty members focusing employability and entrepreneurship development. On Completion of On-line admission process, Workload allotment is done as per University guidelines. Teachers execute their course deliverables as per teaching plan. Faculty members refer to the reference books prescribed by university and update using online resources for effective implementation of curriculum. Teachers are trained in ICT based teaching-learning process. Library resources are constantly upgraded to ensure an effective teaching-learning process. Faculty members participate in the syllabus upgradation and restructuring workshops organized by university. Students are assessed by conducting their internal evaluations and final semester examination. PO/PSO of every course is carried out and corrective measures are taken to improve students' performance. Remedial sessions are conducted for slow learners. Fast learners are promoted to improve their skills for employability. Feedback is taken from the stakeholders. Principal and HOD's conduct regular meetings to review the entire process and review the optimum utilization of infrastructural and instructional facility and document it properly.

Principal's Advisory Committee is entrusted to prepare the academic calendar at end of June for the next consecutive year. Based on inputs from various stakeholders, the committee prepares a schedule of various examinations, classroom assessments, evaluation patterns and co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities. The calendar is designed in consonance with the tentative schedule of the University examinations. All the curricular, co-curricular, and extra-curricular activities are arranged so that the students get ample time for exam preparation. Under the CIA, various tests and assignments are given to students. The faculty members set question papers as per the ordinance of the University and follow the objectives of the course. Every member is expected to follow the university's norms in letter and spirit. The college always strives to give quality education. IQAC opines that the path of overall development of the students passes through the process of internal evaluation; it is a powerful tool to continuously and properly evaluate the learners and help improve their grades. College implemented the following measures: 1. Tutorials and home assignments, seminars, in-class debates. 2. Observations of the students and their performances during the practical sessions for his/her overall up-gradation. 3. Library tour and tutorials on its use.

- Tremendous opportunities are provided by the college to integrate the cross-cutting issues like Gender, Climate Change, Environmental Education, Human Rights, and ICT etc.
- The Women Cell and NSS organize workshops and seminars to sensitize the students about their rights and discuss issues faced by them in the outside world.
- The Eco club has organized “Tree Plantation Drive”, *Swatchh Bharat Abhiyaan, Harit Haryana*, Disaster Management, climate change, mushroom culturing to sensitize students on environmental issues.
- Curriculum of some regular courses address issues related to Environment, Sustainability, Gender and Professional Ethics while some value-added courses aim to inculcate social, human values for the holistic development of students. University has made Environmental Science as a compulsory course for all the First Year under-graduate students. The curriculum of B.Com has Business Ethics raise the general awareness on the ethics, Corporate Social Responsibility. MA English has courses on Gender, Dalit, Post-Colonial, American, Caribbean Literature, which focuses on equality and Human Values. Climatology, Environmental Geography, Soil Geography, Bio-Geography, Hydrology, Oceanography, Water Resource and Management are the courses in MA Geography focuses on environment. MA Political Science Course Political Sociology of India focuses on Democracy-Community Power Structure. Ethical Issues like Morality, Disaster Management, Green Chemistry, Ewaste, are taught as Foundation and open elective subject for CBCS syllabus. Our NSS and Outreach programs handle different environment activities such as Tree plantation, cleanliness, literacy, road safety, Water conservation, Organic farming, Anti-Stubble burning drives campaigns. Many Capacity Building and Personality Development programs are conducted to imbibe universal ethical principles such as honesty, trust, loyalty, mutual-respect, law-abiding, compassion and camaraderie. College also organizes various personality development programs through placement cell.
- The college also conduct various certificate course which are focused on Professional Ethics, Human Values, Environment and Sustainability. For example: Profesional Accounting, First Aid, Soft Skill, Mushroom Farming, Organic Farming, Personality Development etc.
- College also encourages the students to participate in various camps organized by the university like Flora and Fauna Camp, River-rafting Camp, Trekking Camp, Rock Climbing Camp, Snow Skiing Camp, Personality Development Camp, Youth Leadership Camp etc. for these courses/camps College contribute 25% of the total expenditure and students have to contribute only 25% of the total expenditure.

Participative and Innovative Pedagogies are used to achieve the goal of experiential learning. College magazine *Aryapradeepika*, gives platform to the students to participate in learning and giving vent to their expressions. All departments conduct competitions, workshops for the students to showcase their talent by interactive presentations, games, personality assessments and projects regarding cross cutting issues. Poster making, Project competitions, video making competitions are conducted to give experience of making products to the students. Political Science Department organizes Mock Parliament to promote activities of community service and to advocate social or political changes and to promote INDIA AMONGST INDIANS. 'Industrial Visit' by commerce students gives an exposure of industries. Activities like *Falgun Mela*, Youth Festival give the practical experience of culture and traditions. Students of Certificates courses have to undergo compulsory Internships in different Institutions for practical knowledge. Expert's Lectures, Workshops, Field visits and study tours are organized for the students. Students actively participate in events organized by Youth Welfare Department for personality, skill, communication, leadership development. Geography department gives survey based on assignments to the students. Students are encouraged to participate in National, International Conferences.

The departments in collaboration with Literacy Cell have carried out many activities like Students' Presentations, Group Discussions, Debates, Declamation, and Essay writing competition. The Department of Computer Science has given many topics to prepare models or charts to by the students depicting new technologies and tools. For the application of agriculture and rural area based knowledge, NSS and Outreach Cell organises a field camp for the students for a period of 7 days. Departments Like Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Physics, Geography, Computer Science, Mathematics also have conducted student-centric learning methods to develop experimental and participative learning.

2.5 Evaluation Process and Reforms

2.5.1

Mechanism of internal/ external assessment is transparent and the grievance redressal system is time- bound and efficient

Response:

As per the guidelines of Maharshi Dayanand University, the institution appointed Controller of Examination and also constituted a committee to address any grievance related to conduct of Examinations and make policy decisions for transparent and robust internal examinations. College has adopted Choice based credit system from academic year 2016. Student's development is assessed by 20 marks Continuous internal evaluation (CIE). The distribution of internal assessment is: 10 marks for one internal Exams, 5 marks for assignments, 5 marks for attendance (0 for attendance less than 65%, 2 marks for upto 70%, 3 marks for upto 75%, 4 marks for upto 80%, 5 marks for attendance above 80%). The Institute appointed faculty wise internal examination committees to ensure smooth functioning of CIE which follows the university norms in letter and spirit. The college displays the headwise details of the Internal Assessment of each paper on the notice board atleast 10 days before the commencement of the final university examination to give the students an opportunity to make representation in case of any grievance. The record of the internal assessment is retained by all the HOD's for a period of 6 months. Opportunity of re-examination is given to the absent students. All mark lists were submitted to the Maharshi Dayanand University's Examination Department for record both online and in the shape of Hard copy. Rules regarding Internal Assessment are displayed on the website. The students not satisfied with the award of internal assessment marks may approach the Internal Assessment Grievance Redressal Committee within 10 days from the date of declaration of Internal assessment marks.

Redressal System:

Our college follows transparent, time-bound and efficient method of Internal Assessment. The college has appointed Controller of Examination who conducts written examination prior to the university examinations as per schedule issued by Principal. Internal assessment is calculated on attendance, marks in class test and assignment. The distribution of internal assessment is: 10 marks for one internal Exams, 5 marks for assignments, 5 marks for attendance (0 for attendance less than 65%, 2 marks for upto 70%, 3 marks for upto 75%, 4 marks for upto 80%, 5 marks for attendance above 80%). To maintain transparency and uniformity in the assessment of internal tests, the faculty evaluates the papers within a week and the answer sheets are shown to students in class. If any discrepancies are reported by the students, they have to approach Internal Assessment Grievance Redressal Committee (IAGRC). An application duly stating the grievances is to be submitted to IAGRC. The Principal in consultation with IAGRC and faculty member takes necessary steps to resolve the grievances. If any student remains absent during assessment due to valid reasons is given another chance. The Institute follows open evaluation system where the student performance is displayed on the notice board and also on LMS System. Finally, Internal Assessments are uploaded on university ERP at the end of semester. For other grievances like, absent remark for internal assessment or term end examination in statements of marks, college obtains application from the students and forward to the University for necessary action.

Outcome Based Education (OBE) is education in which an emphasis is placed on a clearly articulated idea of what students are expected to know and be able to do, i.e., what skills and knowledge they need to have, when they leave the HEI. The data of complete 2017-2022 batch of all the post graduate courses was analysed. The eight post graduate courses offered by our prestigious college are English, Maths, Geography, Physics, Chemistry, Hindi, Commerce and Political Science under CBCS. Date was considered and therefore both direct and indirect tools were used in the analysis, wherein assignments, class tests and end semester exams constitute the direct tools and exit survey/curriculum feedback and parents' feedback are part of the indirect tools. It is highly pertinent to highlight that, our analysis gives 80% weightage to direct tools and 20% to indirect tools. Furthermore, assignment and class tests accounts for 20% weightage in direct tools and end semester exams accounts for 80%. Similarly, parents' feedback accounts for 20% weightage in indirect tools and exit survey/curriculum feedback accounts for 80%.

Chhotu Ram Arya College has signed MOUs with different institutes to provide the information on entrepreneurship to the students and faculty and for dissemination of knowledge and information to the stakeholders and for research and other academic activities. The college has already entered into collaborative agreement with other institutions for faculty exchange programme and several MOUs have been signed. Faculty members adopt many innovative ways like interactive method, project and field work method, ICT Enabled method, experiment method to make Teaching and learning activities more effective. The academic and research expertise of the Chhotu Ram Arya college continually contribute to the Innovative Ecosystem through breakthrough solutions and suggestions to solve critical problems. An Incubation Centre is established in Chhotu Ram Arya College in collaboration with Centre for Skill Development, to inculcate the idea of Entrepreneurship and Start up in students. 3.4.1

Response:

Well-structured extension activities develop skills in students that significantly contribute to their overall development. In this crucial time, we tried to reach our community through online mode for spreading the message related to health, Individual hygiene and taking responsibility of our family and society.

The NSS unit of the college with active participation of teachers and student volunteers are regularly engaged in various community development programmes at neighbourhood localities and in adopted villages. The NSS unit has done a lot of work including conduction of Health check-up camp, Blood donation camp, Anti-tobacco awareness programme, Awareness programme on Tuberculosis, vaccination camps for Covid-19, MR Vaccination camps, Anti-Stubble Burning Campaign, Traffic Awareness Programs, *Bet Bachao Beti Bachao* Programs, Tree Plantation Campaign, No Plastic Campaign, No to Crackers, Organic Farming etc. Seminar and Workshops on various social issues like gender, women empowerment have also been conducted periodically for raising the awareness level. Response:

Chhotu Ram Arya College sprawls over an area of 16 acres which provides ample framework for carrying out learning process, career progression and advanced education. The institution caters to the needs of about 2500 students. We have one Principal's Office, 2 staff rooms, 12 Department rooms, one Administration room, one Reception, one IQAC room, 2 NSS rooms, 5 Smart class rooms, one seminar hall, one central library, one ladies' common room, , one Women Cell, One SC/ST Cell Room, one Cafeteria, one night guard room, 4 store rooms, Two reading Halls, one open stage, One Sports Room, one Estate Office, one Bursar Room, Parking for Staff and Students, 400 mtr Track for Track & Field Games, One dark room, one Auditorium, One Cultural Activities Room Etc. Besides, there are lavatories, 32 CCTVs, 24 ACs, 8 solar lights, 2 Photocopiers, 6 hanging projectors, one portable projector and 12 printers. We also have one virtual class room. Laboratory: College has 15 laboratories like Physics, Chemistry, Math, Computer Science, Botany, Zoology, Chemistry, Geography, Physical Education etc. Laboratory assistants and attendants look after the general and day-to-day maintenance of the laboratories. Library: College has a very library with two reading halls. Seating arrangement of more than 300 students are made. Library has nearly 36000 books. Library is automated with SOUL 2.1. with OPAC. ICT facilities: The operating systems and antivirus installed in the computers are regularly updated for security and recent advances. Licensed copies of OS are preferred for computers. Advanced Firewall of 'FORTINET' make is installed to college for added safety of the PC and other Devices. The provision of stabilizers and air conditioners is arranged for computer laboratories. Classrooms: College has 49 classrooms fitted with Energy Saving Fans and LED lights. All the classrooms have adequate Study Desks and eco-friendly green boards. All the rooms are nicely and elegantly painted with washable all-weather paint. Drinking Water: RO water filtration plant of 600 Litres/hr. is installed in the college. Drinking water storage tanks in the institute are periodically cleaned and chlorinated. The Department of Geography has a well-equipped Remote Sensing and GIS laboratory.

Chhotu Ram Arya College has wholeheartedly attempted to comply with all the imperative standards expected of the affiliating college as far as infrastructural framework, provision of learning material, ICT devices etc are concerned. Every one of the departments are furnished with sufficient study halls, research facilities, Log Book, Activity Record Book, Attendance Register, blackboards, white board, white chalks, coloured chalks, duster and so on. College faculties are permitted to utilize advanced study hall, meeting room, computers and internet facilities as and when required. The open stage is used for Yoga & Meditation sessions, Annual Prize Distribution Function, Cultural Activities, and Assembly etc. Besides the students and teachers also benefit from the use of gymnasium. The college campus is

secured with Wi-Fi Internet facilities to be utilized by instructors, students and other stakeholders for scholastic and regulatory purposes.

College has constituted various committees viz. Principal's Advisory Committee, Infrastructure Committee, Construction and Repair Committee, etc. for the upkeep and proper maintenance of all types of infrastructure and support facilities on the campus.

Chhotu Ram Arya College has a Central Library which was established since the inception of the college 1951 to cater to the academic needs of the faculty, students and staffs. In 2016 New college library was constructed which is spread over an area of 9600 sq ft area over two floors. It is properly ventilated and have direct throw of sunlight. The library has started automation using Integrated Library Management System (ILMS) since 2015. The SOUL software has been installed in the college library for automation and presently use version: 2.1 is a full-featured open source Library Management software. The library is partly automated. After the books procurement by the library the “Cataloguing” module of SOUL is used to process them and generate the searchable bibliographic record for proper utilization of the resource. Barcode have been generated for books after entering them in SOUL Library Management System. Each book entered into the system has barcode pasted on the front side of the book. The” Reports” module of SOUL is being used to gain general and specific data regarding library services.

The college library is a member of NLIST program of the UGC – INFLIBNET centre for the purpose of accessing the electronic resource like SodhGanga and SodhSindhu. Through this program we have the access to more than 6000 full text electronic journals and more than 3,00,000 full text electronic books.

Central library of college has Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC) which is accessible to the teachers, students and alumnus through internet. Besides the books of different UG and PG courses, the College library has a good collection of journals, reference books, books written by eminent personalities, book bank and books contributed by alumnus. Inter – library loan procured among central library and departmental as well as seminar library. The library provide remote access to the digital resource such as previous years question papers, list of newly arrived books etc. to its users.

TWO BEST PRACTICES OF CHHOTU RAM ARYA COLLEGE, SONEPAT

Introduction of the two best practices:

The institute is proud to claim that two best practices of Chhotu Ram Arya College are Co-curricular activities i.e. the promotion of sports and cultural activities. These two Co-curricular activities are part of the diversified sets of measures taken by the institution to keep pace with the fast-changing scenario of teaching and learning. To support this venture, apart from community services the college focuses on sports and cultural activities.

A full fledged Sports Department is set up to promote sports among faculty and students by providing funding and by framing policies conducive to promotion of sports activities. Our college has earmarked an amount of Rs 8,00,000.00 (Rupees Eight Lac) for promoting the sports activities in the college. The institute has all the facilities which are required for track and field events. Apart from 400m track, there is a huge ground for football, basketball, handball, volleyball, korfbal, hockey, kho-kho and kabaddi.

In the same way a full fledged department is set-up to promote cultural activities involving maximum number of students and faculty members. Our college provides fund of approx. Rs 7,00,000 (Rupees Seven Lac) to organize these activities annually. College has one auditorium and one large room specially earmarked for this activity and other facilities which are available to each and every student of the college without any discrimination on caste, class, and creed. These facilities are available throughout the year.

- To take measures for the safety of girl students.
- To organize lectures and workshops for sports and cultural activities.
- To organize annual sports meet.
- To encourage participants with medals and cash prizes on annual function day.

Details of Practices

1. Sports:

To promote and make sports facilities available to each and every student of the college, a Multi-tier system is adopted in the college.

1. **Kindergarten:** On the field students are candidly observed by our highly trained and technically advanced faculty members. They make their observations on the caliber and physical fitness of all the students on the fields.
2. **Nursery:** Based on the observations of the faculty members, the students are allotted different games and sent to the nurseries of different games for further training and practice. The sports nurseries are run by the college some in collaboration with the Sports Department, Govt. of Haryana, some are in collaboration with Sports Authority of India, and some are run by Prominent Sports persons.
3. **Club:** Selected sportspersons are divided into different groups and competitions are conducted among the different clubs at regular intervals of time.
4. **Selection:** Just after the announcement of the Sports Calendar by the University, open trials are organized by the college of almost all the games that appear in the University Sports List. Double the number of scheduled strengths of the game are shortlisted for the final selection of the team.

Title of the Practice

Social Cohesion Outreach Programme in Rural Areas)

INTRODUCTION:

One of the distinguishing features of the education at Chhotu Ram Arya College is to create a feeling of camaraderie, companionship, empathy, and solidarity towards the deprived and marginalized section of society. The institute has a long history of imparting quality education to the under-privileged and marginalized sections of society. In the field of community service, the college has been continuing its long-running program to serve rural community which has been institutionalized as “**Adopt a Village**” in 2020 2021. As a part of this programme the college adopts a village in the Sonipat district. For the betterment of this village, we have a practice to organize a seven-day camp as decided by the NSS advisory Committee. In this camp, students stay as a community and cook for themselves. Students remain engaged in socially relevant and meaningful activities intending to address social issues prevalent in the region which are either swept under the carpet or ignored deliberately. Another feature of this camp is to sensitize students to the socio-economic problems of our rural areas. The volunteers interact with villagers, with students through quizzes, staging street plays, participating in cleanliness drives, and addressing different issues related to deprived gender, caste, and class. The practices of ‘Social Cohesion’ furtherance the removal of discrimination on the basis of caste, class and gender in society and institutions as well. In addition to the interaction with villagers and exposure to their problems, the students make them aware of different government policies and projects. The students also participate in rallies for important causes such as the march for science, increasing climate change awareness, HIV awareness, etc. Further to this, the students also participate in cleanliness drives in popular landmarks in the city, and spread messages for safe driving, etc. As the college gains experience, the program is being made richer to provide even better outcomes - both for the community in these villages and the students. To empower girl students, the authorities invite the parents of the girl students and convince them of the relevance of social work and co-curricular activities.

This distinctive practice targets:

1. To enable students to comprehend, connect, and critically reflect on social issues which are of serious concern.
2. To augment the process of social conscientiousness, responsibility, and accountability towards the marginalized, downtrodden, deprived, and oppressed sections of society.
3. To provide a workable and executable space for students to invest their creative bests and talents to uplift and assist the deprived and oppressed communities.
4. To promote college—community interaction and collaboration to build an inclusive society for mutual learning and contribution.
5. The students also engage in the following activities:
 - **Tree-plantation Drive:** an initiative adopted to develop a community forest.
 - **Beti Bachao, Beti Padhao:** An initiative of Haryana Govt. to educate the people to abstain from female feticides, and to educate the girls.
 - **Swachh Bharat Abhiyaan:** A very enthusiastic campaign by the Indian Govt. to make your surroundings and the country free from filth.
 - **Govt. Schemes of Social Benefits** like Mukhya Mantri Vivah Shagun Yojna, Ladli Pension

Yojna, Apki Beti Hamari Beti, Kishori Shakti Yojna, Kanya Kosh, Pradhan Mantri Matru Vandhana Yojna

Visit to old-age homes, destitute homes, orphanages, and children's homes is one of the regular practices of students and faculty members, where they interact emotionally with the inmates and engaged themselves in support for the less fortunate and marginalized people.

The objective of this programme is to engage all the students of Chhotu Ram Arya College to bring them face-to-face to social realities and the lives of the underprivileged, deprived, and marginalized people of our society. The vision of this type of interaction would be transformative and informative and encourage them to combat the inequities of the prevailing social order.
